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Built by Russell & Company, Port Glasgow, Scotland, 1908. 8,347 gross tons; 460 feet long; 58 feet wide. Steam triple expansion engines, twin screw. Service speed 14 knots. 2,190 passengers (60 first class, 2,000 second class, 2,000 third class).

Built for Austro-Americana Line, Austria. Renamed **Martha Washington** in 1908 and renamed **Martha Washington** in 1917. Laid up at New York City in 1917. Seized by US Government, in 1917 and renamed **USC-101**. Troopship service. Sold to Italy in 1933 and renamed **Avi**. Burned and scrapped in 1934.
